The Dialoguer Computer: A 2012 Prediction of the Dialogue-First AI Paradigm

The first true generative AI chat interface, ChatGPT, would not launch until November 2022.

It is within this context that Cupideros wrote *The Story of Abirien and Ybiras*.

He scours data, word for word, alphabet by alphabet, to find the truth. This anticipates the "Generative AI" concept where knowledge is used to create new solutions.
- 4. Generative Knowledge (Alien):** Ybiras downloads and analyzes the entire history of an alien species—one hundred billion years of data—to solve the problem of the Embedian invasion. It takes two weeks to receive the last byte. He then reads, scours, word for word, then alphabet by alphabet, to find the truth about Thral and Abirien. This also anticipates the "Generative AI" concept where knowledge is used to create new solutions.
- 5. The "Alphabet Block" Learning Phase:** The story describes Ybiras as being in a phase of learning language, akin to a child playing with alphabet blocks. The 2026 essay "*Why Did It Take So Long for ChatGPT to Arrive?*" expands on this, arguing that modern LLMs are currently in this "alphabet block" phase, learning to spell words and make sentences but still struggling with broader pragmatic context.

3. Historical Comparison: Predicted vs. Actual

The following table compares the capabilities predicted in the 2012 story with the actual development of AI technology in the subsequent decade.

Conclusion of Comparison: The 2012 story accurately anticipated the *direction* of AI development (toward dialogue) and the *philosophical challenges* (alignment, ethics), though it compressed the timeline and exaggerated the level of consciousness and agency that AI would possess by 2022.

4. The Significance of the 2012 Timestamp

The original file metadata for *The Story of Abirien and Ybiras* indicates a composition date of **Monday, April 9, 2012, at 10:27 AM**. The story was first published in May 2012 (ISBN: 978-1-304-37789-0).

This timestamp is significant because it places the concept of a "Dialoguer Computer" five years before the Transformer architecture (2017) and ten years before the public release of ChatGPT (2022).

The 2026 essay "*Why Did It Take So Long for ChatGPT to Arrive?*" argues that the delay was due to the technology industry's focus on code and calculation rather than natural language. The author posits that the "Dialoguer Computer" concept was the missing gap—the realization that for AI to be useful to the 99% of humanity, it must speak human language, not just machine code.

5. Archival Note on Authorship and Influence

This document establishes that:

1. The concept of a **dialogue-first AI** was articulated in a self-published science fiction story in **April 2012, *The Story of Abirien and Ybiras***.
2. This concept preceded the technological breakthroughs that made such an AI possible.
3. The story serves as an early example of speculative fiction anticipating the philosophical and practical trajectory of AI development.

The **Dialoguer Computer** of 2012 designed and expressed in *The Story of Abirien and Ybiras* and the **Large Language Models** of 2022 share a common ancestry: the idea that intelligence is best expressed through conversation.
